### **Horst Construction is awarded new contracts - Turkey Hill and Lancaster Bible College projects in central Pennsylvania; Luther Village project in Delaware**

**Horst Construction**, of Lancaster, PA, has signed a \$660,000 contract to build a Turkey Hill Minit Markets convenience store (store #298) at 5400 Bath Pike, in Hanover Township, Bethlehem. The new 3936-square-foot store, scheduled for completion in the fall, features a six-pump fuel island.

**McCluggagy Van Sickle and Perry**, of Wichita, KS, is the project architect. Horst has been supporting Turkey Hill with its ongoing expansion efforts for several years. The Bath Pike location represents the eighth store Horst Construction has built for Turkey Hill. It has also remodeled the interiors of 15 existing Turkey Hill stores and is contracted to remodel ten additional units.

**Horst Construction**, of Lancaster, PA, is renovating the Good Shepherd Chapel on the campus of Lancaster Bible College as part of a 3-month construction project valued at \$900,000. Originally built by Horst in 2001, the chapel is the centerpiece of the LBC campus and will undergo extensive interior renovations, including completion of the balcony with the addition of 300 stadium-style seats, expanding choir and music rehearsal space, and relocating the sound booth from the balcony to the main floor. The project is slated for completion by September. **Cornerstone Design Architects** is the architect for the project.

**Horst Construction**, of Lancaster, PA, is building phase II of Luther Village, a senior-living residence on the Luther Village campus in Dover, DE, for a projected cost of \$4.4 million. Similar to phase I, which was completed by Horst in November, 2006, Luther Village II is a three-story, 54,402-square-foot facility featuring 68 age-restricted, independent-living apartments. **Del Ciotto Architects, Inc.**, of North Wales, PA, is the architect on the project, which is scheduled for completion in January, 2009. Luther Village is owned by Luther Towers of Dover, Inc.

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
